PROJECT OVERVIEW

The new Louisville PK-5 Building is being co-funded by the local Louisville community as well as the Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC). This new building, as currently planned, is slated to house approximately 1,114 students in all grades district-wide Pre-Kindergarten through fifth grade, under approximately 128,778 SF of building area.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

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The building site will include all necessary parking for students, staff and visitors. Paved access drives and sidewalks will be provided for safe and secure separation between vehicular, bus and pedestrian circulation. One main entrance off of North Nickelplate Street is envisioned, with one exit onto North Nickelplate Street and one exit onto Washington Avenue via North Silver Street. The new building is intended to be sited such that the main entrance is visible from the approach on Nickelplate Street, and academic areas oriented generally towards the wooded backdrop of the building offered by this unique site.

The interior of the building, currently under design, will likely include the following main academic and other spaces:

- 1 pre-kindergarten classroom
- 5 kindergarten classrooms
- 40 academic classrooms
- Extended learning spaces
- Teacher prep/workrooms
- Instructional material storage rooms
- 12 special education rooms with conference and private restroom/shower
- Main office, reception, secretary, principal and assistants, guidance , career center and clinic
- Media Center and support spaces
- 2 art rooms with storage and kilns
- 2 music rooms
- 1 competition-size gymnasium, with one main court and two cross courts, climbing wall, bleachers and sound system
- Student dining, staff dining, and full-service kitchen
- Stage
- Large group restrooms, central storage, loading/receiving area, custodial and other support spaces

Once complete, the building should serve the students attending Louisville City Schools, and the Louisville community for many years to come and be on par with other new and renovated facilities across the state of Ohio.
